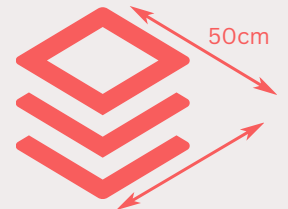


# Palletising instructions



1. Whenever possible start the flooring uplift before the structural strip out or demolition, such as walls, ceilings and windows.

2. Only tiles of the same size (e.g. 50 x 50 cm squares) per pallet.



3. Carpet tiles to be stacked 4 piles to a pallet (125m<sup>2</sup>/ pallet). Carpet tiles should not be stacked back-to-back.

4. Pallets of carpet tiles should not be double-stacked.



5. Shrink wrap pallets, using a transparent wrap whenever possible.

6. Please ensure pallets are sheltered and kept in dry conditions until collection.



7. We accept off cuts. Please stack them on the pallet, on top of the full tiles.

**Note:** When shrink-wrapping carpet tiles...

Try to avoid curling edges



If possible, protect with cardboard
